PT-to-CEFR Alignment Chart

Every English PopTalk lesson is built at one of four PT Levels, each mapped one-to-one with a CEFR band. The mapping is fixed: it never shifts based on topic, age track, or market. PT-5 (C1) and PT-6 (C2) are fully specified and reserved for future release.

TWO-AXIS MODEL

PT Level sets the CEFR target.

Age Track (Young Learner, Teen, or Adult) shapes topic framing and game style — never the CEFR level.

LESSON STRUCTURE

Five passages + five games.

Every PT-1 through PT-4 lesson pairs each reading passage with its own game, plus a bonus Phrase Match review.

PRODUCTION SCOPE

PT-1 through PT-4 are active.

PT-5 (CEFR C1, Advanced) and PT-6 (CEFR C2, Mastery) are fully specified for future release.
